Commemoration of the liquidation
of the Litzmannstadt Ghetto



The author of the drawing used as the logo for the commemorations, which represents a silhouette of the Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary – the tallest building on the terrain of the Litzmannstadt Ghetto – and the bridge on Zgierska, is Abraham Koplłowicz. He was born on 18 February 1930 in Łódź, the only child of Mendel and Yochet Gittel Koplłowicz. Taken from the ghetto along with his parents on the last transport to Auschwitz, he perished in the gas chamber in September 1944.

Eliezer Grynfeld, whose mother married after the war Mendel Koplłowicz, found after the death of his stepfather several memorabilia, including a school exercise book with a hand-drawn illustration on the cover along with the title "Litzmannstadt-Ghetto 1943" and the words: A. KOPLOWICZ "HIS OWN WORKS".

Litzmannstadt Ghetto

(1940–1944)



In February 1940 the German chief of Łódź police issued an order that a special district for Jews was to be created in the north of the city. Jews had to leave their homes in other parts of Łódź to live in Bałuty and Stare Miasto (the Old City). At the same time Poles and Germans were forced to move out of the area designated only for Jews. This was the beginning of the Łódź Ghetto. On 30 April 1940, the ghetto was completely isolated from the rest of the city. Łódź was at that time known as Litzmannstadt, the name given to it by the Germans.

The Litzmannstadt Ghetto was surrounded by barbed wire fencing and guarded by German sentries. The Nazis demolished many homes adjacent to this terrain to hamper any attempts to escape. From May 1940 the Ghetto was administered by Hans Biebow, a German merchant from Bremen, and answerable to him was a Jewish Council led by the Head of the Council of Elders, Mordechai Chaim Rumkowski. The ghetto initially had around 160,000 inhabitants. In the autumn of 1941, the Germans transported nearly 20,000 Jews here from Prague, Vienna, Luxembourg, Berlin, Hamburg, Frankfurt and other parts of Europe as well as over 5,000 Gypsies (Roma and Sinti) from the Austrian–Hungarian borderlands. Then another 17,000 Jews were brought from the surrounding towns and villages, including Brzeziny, Łask, Ozorków, Pabianice, Włocławek and many others. All in all, more than 200,000 Jews passed through the Łódź Ghetto. In December 1942, a separate camp for Polish children was created within the ghetto, known as the Przemysłowa Street camp. It existed until the end of the war. Litzmannstadt Ghetto was the longest lasting ghetto established on Polish soil by the Germans. The others were liquidated by the Nazis in 1942 and 1943.

January 1942 saw mass deportations begin from Łódź to the Kulmhof extermination camp (Chełmno on Ner). Between January and September over 70,000 people were murdered there by the Germans. The most important moment in the history of the ghetto was the so-called “Wielka Szpera” (Allgemeine Gehspere, General Curfew), when the Germans ordered to deport all those who were unable to work: sick, old people and children under the age of 10. Afterwards relative peace reigned. Transportations were renewed in June 1944, first to Chełmno, then to Auschwitz–Birkenau.

The last group of Jews from Łódź is believed to have left for Auschwitz on 29 August 1944.

There are only a few, at most several thousand people, who survived the war and went through the Litzmannstadt Ghetto. The very few Survivors are scattered around the world.

Since 2004, in Łódź, on August 29, the City of Łódź has organized the commemoration of paying tribute to the victims and the memory of the Survivors and the Righteous Among the Nations.
